### FROM THE OFFICE OF THE PRESIDENT.....

Spring is just around the corner and we have been very busy in the Village and our Public Works Department will continue to get things ready for the nice weather as it comes to us. I think we can all agree that our Departments have done a great job this winter with dealing with snow plowing, water needs and waste water requirements during the adverse conditions of winter.

We continue to have strong growth in the Village with over \$3,000,000 of building permits already approved this year! The Wood Pointe Subdivision continues to see development and will also see much more as the warmer weather arrives. We are excited to be able to offer great single family lots for people to have the opportunity to move into the Village. Multifamily apartments continue to be built at Heritage Farm Apartments and additional units will be built at Village Park Apartments as well. We will see a great deal of progress on the Ulta Beauty site (next to Charcoal Grill) as well as Pizza Ranch (next to Golden Corral) in 2017 as well.

The Village is in the process of selling approximately 8 acres of land in the Crossroads Commons Development that was donated to the Village by Told Development at the end of 2016. The Developer has been working with Village staff to finalize plans for 70-80,000 sq. ft. of commercial space next to Goodwill. In addition, the property previously known as Tree Acres is seeing an increased amount of interest and announcements may be coming in the very near future regarding additional development on that property.

This summer we will be seeing almost \$3,000,000 worth of road construction within the Village to continue to maintain our roads and keep them in great driving condition for our residents and guests. This has and will continue to be a commitment from the Village so that we have roads in as good a condition as possible to avoid costly emergency repairs if left unmaintained.

### BRUSH & YARD MATERIAL PICKUP SCHEDULED

The Village offers one spring and one fall curbside brush/yard materials pickup each year.

- ◆ Spring Curbside brush pickup will begin Monday, April 3rd
- ◆ Spring Curbside yard materials pickup will begin Monday, April 10th

**Above pickup dates are subject to change due to weather conditions!**

Crews will begin picking up at 7:00 a.m. and will make only one pass through the Village. Crews **WILL NOT** go back and pick up any brush/yard

materials placed at the curbside after 7:00 a.m. of the dates listed.

On occupied corner lots, set out brush/yard materials on one side of the lot only. Apartment complexes and businesses will be served at the business entrance. If you have questions on pickup, please call 715-345-5257.

The yard material/brush drop-off site located at the Wastewater Treatment Facility on Coolidge Avenue opens for the season Thursday, April 6th, 12:00 noon. Residents may dispose of excess brush/yard materials during the following days and hours:

### YARD MATERIAL/ BRUSH DROP-OFF SITE HOURS.....

- ◆ Monday and Thursday 12:00 noon to 6:00 pm
- ◆ Saturday 9:00am to 3:00 pm
- ◆ **PROOF OF RESIDENCY IS MANDATORY.**
- ◆ Brush-only ONE pile per day no larger than 10' long, 6' wide, 4' high per parcel. **No contractors/commercial haulers.**
- ◆ Stumps, tree trunks, logs of any size, sod, dirt, timbers, rocks, concrete, boards or foreign material **WILL NOT** be accepted.

### REFUSE/RECYCLING UPDATES

Refuse and recycling collection dates within the Village are Monday, Tuesday, and Wednesday. No pickups will be made on the following legal holidays:

If the holiday falls on either Monday, Tuesday or Wednesday your refuse & recycling for that week will run one day late. The weeks of Memorial Day, 4th of July, Labor Day, and Christmas Day will create a one day late for pickup of refuse and recycling in 2017.

### ATTENTION VILLAGE OF PLOVER RESIDENTS

#### ALL DOGS MUST BE LICENSED WITHIN THE VILLAGE

Portage County Ordinance requires that, by March 31st of each year, or upon reaching 5 months of age, all dogs must be licensed and must have current, valid rabies vaccination. Licenses issued after March 31st will include an additional \$5.00 late fee.

Dog licenses for the Village of Plover are available at the Village Office in the Plover Municipal Center, 2400 Post Road, Plover. Office hours are 7:30am to 4:30pm Monday through Friday.

A current copy of the dog's rabies vaccination certificate from the veterinarian must be provided for the issuance of all licenses.

Licenses may also be obtained by mail. Simply mail the rabies certificate, along with the applicable license fee to: Village of Plover, ATTN: Pet Licensing, PO Box 37, Plover, WI 54467. The rabies certificate, showing the current owner's name and address, will contain all the information required for issuance of the license. It will be returned, along with the license receipt and tag, by return mail.

Compliance with this licensing requirement is essential. The Village's share of the Portage County Control Contract cost is decreased in relation to the number of licenses issued.

Also, a dog caught running at large, without a license and valid rabies vaccination, would be subject to fines in excess of \$150.00 for each offense. Further questions, please call the Village of Plover office 715-345-5250.

## 2017 ROAD RECONSTRUCTION UPDATE

2017 will be another busy year for transportation projects in the Village of Plover. This year the Village will be working on local street reconstruction projects, as part of its 3 year recurring program. This year 34 streets (approximately 10 miles of Village streets) will be reconstructed or have overlays. A list of each street project can be found in the article below. The first set of notifications have been sent to property owners who will be affected by street reconstruction in their neighborhood. Work associated with street reconstructions will begin as soon as all the snow has melted and frost is out of the ground.

One of the more significant projects this year will be the reconstruction of Okray Avenue, from Tommy's Turnpike to River Drive (1.5 miles). The Village had hoped to install a pedestrian path as part of this project, however, the Village was unsuccessful in obtaining a grant for this portion of the project. Village staff hope that the pedestrian path will be able to be funded with the next round of street reconstruction projects in 2020.

If a street reconstruction project is occurring in your neighborhood and you or a family member has specific transportation needs, please contact Public Works Manager, Bill Konkol, so that appropriate accommodations can be provided.

Other paving projects include repaving two municipal parking lots, including the north parking lot of the Plover

Municipal Building and the Town Hall Center Parking Lot.

The Village will also be constructing a new dual tennis/pickle ball court in the Woyak Sport Complex just south of the Boys and Girls Club Building. The new court will replace the tennis courts currently located in Easlan-Weslan Park.

In other news, Phase 1 of the Business 51 Reconstruction Project (from Green Avenue to Bea Jay Lane) has been completed, except for some landscaping elements that will be completed this year. The next phase of the project moves to the Village of Whiting in 2018 and 2019. Business 51 will be reconstructed from Minnesota Avenue through the Tommy's Turnpike/Porter Road intersection starting in 2018. The road will remain open as it was with the Phase I project. The third and final phase of the project will occur in 2022, when Business 51 will be reconstructed from Tommy's Turnpike/Porter Road to Springville Drive.

Your cooperation and patience are appreciated during these reconstruction projects. Please remember that we will strive to ensure safe working conditions, safety for the traveling public, and timely completion of these transportation projects.

The Village will also be constructing a new dual tennis/pickle ball court in the Woyak Sport Complex just south of the Boys and Girls Club Building. Construction for these courts will start in the spring of 2017 with an anticipated completion/opening in mid-summer depending on the weather.

We also have two Municipal Parking Lot that will be reconstructed in 2017. These will be the north parking lot of the Plover Municipal Building adjacent to School Drive and the Town Hall Center Parking Lot located along Post Road between Green Avenue and Willow Drive.

**PUBLIC WORKS UPDATES ON CUTTING/TRIMMING OF TREES/SHRUBBERY.....**

Throughout the year the Village of Plover Public Works Department will be cutting and trimming trees/shrubbery that are encroaching upon any Village streets and walks. Also during this time, cutting/trimming of vision obstructions at all intersections throughout the entire Village will be performed. Village Ordinance 483-07 B. "Clear Vision Triangle". No new tree, shrub, hedge or other growth exceeding thirty (30) inches in height above street grade shall be permitted in any clear vision triangle within the Village. Existing trees and shrubs that are located in a clear vision triangle shall be kept trimmed so that the lowest branches projecting over the public street or right-of-way provide a clearance of not less than 16 feet.

C. "Obstruction of Signs, Signals, Travel". All public and private trees and shrubs located adjacent to the public way shall be kept trimmed so that the lowest projecting branches provide a clearance height of not less than sixteen (16) feet above the travel portion of a public street, and not less than ten (10) feet above the public sidewalk. The Village Forester may waive the provisions of this section for newly planted or naturally low-profile trees if he/she determines that they do not interfere with public travel, obstruct the light of any street light, obstruct the view of any traffic sign or signal, or endanger public safety.
