

PROOF OF RESIDENCE

ALL ELECTORS REGISTERING TO VOTE MUST PROVIDE PROOF OF RESIDENCY AS OUTLINED BELOW.

ELECTORS MUST HAVE RESIDED AT THEIR CURRENT ADDRESS FOR 28 DAYS PRIOR TO ELECTION DAY.

Registrants **must** provide their Wisconsin driver's license/I.D. number and expiration date on the form. If they **have not** been issued a driver's license or a Wisconsin I.D., they must provide the last four digits of their social security number.

Acceptable Forms of Proof of Residence

Must contain a current and complete name, including both first and last name AND

Must contain a current and complete residential address, including a numbered address, and the name of a municipality. (Cannot accept documents with just a P.O. Box number on them).

Forms which have an expiration date must be valid on the day they register in order to constitute acceptable proof of residence for the upcoming election.

- A current and valid Wisconsin driver license or identification card.
- Any other official identification card or license issued by a Wisconsin governmental body or unit.
- Any identification card issued by an employer in the normal course of business and bearing a photo of the card holder, but not including a business card.
- A real estate tax bill or receipt for the current year or the year preceding the date of the election.
- A university, college, or technical college identification card (must include photo) ONLY if the voter provides a fee receipt dated within the last 9 months or the institution provides a certified housing list to the municipal clerk.
- A gas, electric, or telephone service statement (utility bill) for the period commencing no earlier than 90 days before registration.
- Bank statement issued by a bank or credit union. (**not** a checkbook)
- Mortgage statement issued by a bank or credit union.
- Home equity credit line statement issued by a bank or credit union
- Credit card statement issued by a bank or credit union.
- Retail store credit card statement (Kohl's, Menards, etc). NOT credit card offers or general correspondence.
- Paycheck.
- A check or other document issued by a unit of government.
- An affidavit on public or private social service agency letterhead identifying a homeless voter and describing the individual's residence for voting purposes.
- Residential lease that is effective on date of registration. (*Not acceptable if registering by mail*)
- An intake document from a residential care facility such as a nursing home or assisted living facility
