

## Chapter 431

### RUMMAGE AND GARAGE SALES

**[HISTORY: Adopted by the Village Board of the Village of Plover 6-4-1985 as §§ 12.18 and 12.25 of the 1985 Code. Amendments where noted where applicable.]**

#### GENERAL REFERENCES

#### § 431-1. License required.

No person shall conduct a rummage or garage sale within the Village without having obtained a license from the Village Clerk, except as provided in § 431-2 below. Before issuing the license, the Clerk shall refer the application to the Building Inspector for verification as to whether or not such sale at the proposed location is compatible with Chapter 550, Zoning, of this Code.

#### § 431-2. Exceptions.

No person shall be required to obtain a license if:

- A. The sale is conducted in a business district and is a permitted use in such district.
- B. The person conducts, on his own residential premises, no more than three sales in any one year. Each sale may be held for no more than three consecutive days and shall not be conducted between the hours of 8:00 p.m. and 8:00 a.m.
- C. The sale is conducted by religious, educational, charitable or civic organizations on premises located in a residential district no more than three times in any one year. Each such sale may be held for no more than three consecutive days and shall not be conducted between the hours of 8:00 p.m. and 8:00 a.m.

#### § 431-3. License fee.

The license fee shall be as provided in the Village Fee Schedule per sale, such sale not to exceed three days.<sup>1</sup>

#### § 431-4. Violations and penalties.<sup>2</sup>

Any person who shall violate any provision of this chapter shall be subject to a penalty as provided in § 1-4 of this Code. A separate offense shall be deemed committed on each day on which a violation of this chapter occurs or continues.
